Club must achieve the Presidential Citation

Appoint a District Conference Chair and send contact information to either of the District Conference Co- Chairs, Kelly Harrill or Marlee Foster by 9/1/09

Pres-Elect must attend PETS in March 2010 (attendance at any PETS is acceptable)

- Club to have 10% of membership (including spouse/quests) registered for District Conference 2010
- Club has Rotarians who are attending District Conference for the first time
- Vice President (President-Nominee) attends PETS in March 2010
- Club prepares / implements strategic/long range plan
- Club organizes club structure based on the RI Club Leadership Plan
- Club sends at least one member to Rotary Leadership Institute during Rotary year 2009-2010
- Club member serves in District leadership capacity
- Club recites the “Four Way Test” at every club meeting
- Post “Four Way Test” in local work places

Foundation

- Club is currently a 100% PHF club (on a single day between 7/1/09 and 3/26/10, all club members are certified as Paul Harris Fellows)
- Club adds new Bequest Society Member (Rotarian) between 7/1/09 and 3/26/10
- Club adds new Major Donor (Rotarian) between 7/1/09 and 3/26/09
- Club add new Paul Harris Society member (Rotarian) between 7/1/09 and 3/26/10

Update Online District Data Base by 12/1/09 (see Note 1)

- Participate in 3 District fellowship events
- Make 4-Way Test a part of meetings or newsletters
- Create or continue “Health and Happiness” updates on members
- Have more members at the Foundation dinner this year than last (including spouse/guest)
- Club achieves overall attendance of 70% or better for the year
- 100% attendance at any one meeting or function
- Submit four or more public relations articles concerning club activities using:
